Michael Arthur Hellbusch, 55, went home to his Lord on September 3, 2018. Mike was born September 14, 1962 in St. Louis, Missouri.

Mike epitomized love and devotion. He loved his country and respected his flag. He is a veteran of the United States Air Force, serving his country from 1982 to 1987, accomplishing the rank of Sergeant. Anyone who knew Mike knew he had well informed political views and was not shy when sharing them.

He loved hard work. Mike earned his Bachelor's Degree from Pima College, in Tuscon, and eventually worked in the healthcare industry. He attained Vice President, Enterprise Quality and Regulatory Affairs for Joerns after 13 loyal years of service.

He loved nature. Mike and Jenny had a cabin in Rhinelander, Wisconsin where they enjoyed listening to the wind blowing through the trees and working outside. Although Jenny was better than Mike at golf, he did at least try.

He loved God. Through his illness, he gained a relationship with God that gave him strength to overcome the obstacles that attempted to steal his peace. A good friend and former pastor of St. John's Lutheran Church, Pastor Bill Dasch, once prayed over Mike. In that moment, Mike felt the power of that prayer. He battled his illness for six years. Mike's faith was important to him.

He loved his wife. For a brief time, Jenny and Mike worked at Allied Signal together. Jenny flirted with Mike and then asked him if he wanted to do a bar-b-que together. Cooking was a common trait with Mike and Jenny. They often had wing cook-offs, grilling cook-offs and spaghetti sauce challenges. Jenny admits Mike often won the challenges, giving him the title of "Pit Master". Mike and Jenny were married December 29, 1993 and with their hearts full of love for one another, they cooked, together, for 24 years.

He loved his family and friends, country music and had a great singing voice.

He loved animals, especially his dogs, who filled his life with joy, Syko, Tara and, his current dog, Jackie.

Mike is survived by his wife, Jenny and his mother Margaret Brinkman Hellbusch.

For those blessed to have known and love Mike, they are better because of him. He will always be missed and cherished.

Michael also turned me on to racquetball down at the courts at McHale Center on the U of A campus. Mike taught me how to play and I loved it, so we played quite a bit at those courts. We didn't attend the school, so we couldn't get reservations. We would just look for an empty court and play until we got kicked out. We didn't get kicked out much.

One time, though, we were playing and a big, intimidating, but nice, coach from the winter-practice-visiting Minnesota Vikings came in, having reserved the court. His partner had not arrived yet, so he invited us to stay and help him warm up with a game of cutthroat, basically every man for himself. Keep in mind this is a charismatic pro football coach with two local high schoolers; I'm thinking we were sophomores. So he serves and the ball bounces to Michael. Michael was no slouch when it came to ball speed off the serve, and we're both swinging to impress, so Mike blasts this thing and it sails straight for this guy's bald spot on the back of his head. TWANG! Mike and I are kind of frozen in place wondering what's coming next, but they guy just shakes it off and says, "Re-serve." So Michael re-serves and, you know what's coming, Michael blasts him again, this time right in the back. I know from experience, that a full wind-up swing blasting you in the back stings like crazy. That's bad enough, but right after getting blasted seconds before in the bean seems intentional. It wasn't, but it sure looked that way. Michael and I quickly excused ourselves and left the court to him. It still cracks me up 40 years later.

Fast forward again a few years, 1981-'84, to when Michael and I would go to KWFJ Tuesday Night at the Outlaw. You had to get there early so you could get a plastic pitcher you could refill with beer throughout the night. We would split up and dance with any women that would dance with us. We got so sweaty we would have to go outside a couple of times a night and wring out our shirts. Quite gross when you think about it. Can't really imagine why women would dance with us in that condition, but they would. Good times.

One afternoon at my parents' house I cracked myself up thinking about how funny it would be to go to the Wildcat, the primary U of A bar, now defunct, dressed in cutoffs, dingo boots, long tube socks, cutoff sleeveless tees, my dad's ultra-skinny ties from the 50s, I in my WW2 army helmet with John Lennon sunglasses, and Michael in a bright red Lutheran Pioneers cowboy hat and aviator sunglasses. Just playing fools. I told Mike about it and we just laughed our heads off at the thought of it and I thought that was that. However, after working on cars with Derek one Saturday, Michael drops by Derek's and plunks a Foster's Lager in front me and says, "Drink up. We're doing the Freak thing at the Wildcat tonight!" So about an hour later we're at the door to the Wildcat waiting to get in and the crowd and bouncers are loving it! Now you can go one of two ways with something like this. You can be embarrassed and play it sheepish or you can say, well, you know what you can say, and just go for it. Well, we went for it, and it was awesome! Strutting around like Steve Martin and Dan Akroyd as two "Wild and Crazy Guys". Complete anonymous idiots! We never danced so much in all our trips to the Wildcat. Again, good times.

This is Kevin.

First, I need to say, I loved Mike like a brother, and his passing leaves a huge hole in my life, so I can't even imagine what you are feeling right now. I'm so sorry for your loss. Karen's and my thoughts and prayers are with you during this crappy grieving process. Friends of 47 years don't come through your life very often.

I'm going to relate some wonderful, at least to me, memories of fun with Michael, perhaps a bit mawkishly, that you may not have heard about.

My first memory of Michael was Sep 1971, Mr. Robinson's class at Redeemer Lutheran School, my first day of fourth grade in a new school. I wasn't feeling well and went to, of course, the front of the class, to Mr. Robinson's desk, to tell him about it. I started to speak, but my innards decided to show him instead. I projectile vomited on the floor, on Mr. Robinsons desk, and, probably, a little on Mr. Robinson. My mother was called, and as I was walking out on the way to my mother's car, Michael comes running from the boy's bathroom toward the class trailing a six foot piece of paper towel yelling, "Geronimo!" I can only imagine, looking back, that he was so chipper because having fetched the cleaning materials he didn't have to use them. Growing through Redeemer, Michael and I were always competing to see who could get the better grades. Michael always seemed to edge me out by a point or two. This trend continued for the rest of our lives. But Mike never condescended or gloated. That was not the way he was built.

The same was true when it came to sports. Michael was always a bit faster, could jump a bit farther, a little bit better shot in basketball, a little better at pool, a little better at racquetball, etc., etc.

Fast forward a few years to high school, 1977-'80. We got interested in music and stereo systems. Michael, Derek, and I would hook our systems into one giant system and get a bit blasted while listening to excellent albums. During one of these adventures at Derek's parents place, we turned the volume way up and ran down the street, later realizing we were in our socks, to see how far we could hear the music. It was still in high school that Michael turned me on to Tucson city bus #15 that took you down to the U of A. Several great stories in that timeframe. One involved Lowie's Lower Level, one of the eateries in the Student Union. One of the great things about Lowie's Lower Level was the all-you-can-eat shake machine (same price whether you get a little or a lot). The shakes were very thick, almost soft-serve ice cream. Almost, but not quite. We loaded our shakes up WAY over the tops of the cups and proceeded to the cashier, where they started to ooze and fall over. We paid for our shakes under the disapproving glare of our cashier, having to hold the leaning blobs so they didn't plop onto the cafeteria tray. We returned the following week to find a sign that doubled the charge for filling past the rim.
